Our Mission Statement

The mission of Mothers Against Methamphetamine is to glorify God by providing competent and compassionate drug education and rehabilitation resources that reflect the mercy of Jesus Christ for the addict, his family, and the community.

The Methamphetamine Problem

An epidemic of addiction is sweeping this nation.

The drug is called methamphetamine, an extremely potent form of "speed" that is ravaging our youth and young adults. Meth is the most addictive drug on the planet. Even just one dose can destroy the self control section of the brain. It is cheap and easy to make. Methamphetamine addiction is destroying homes and abandoning children by the thousands in communities just like yours all over America.



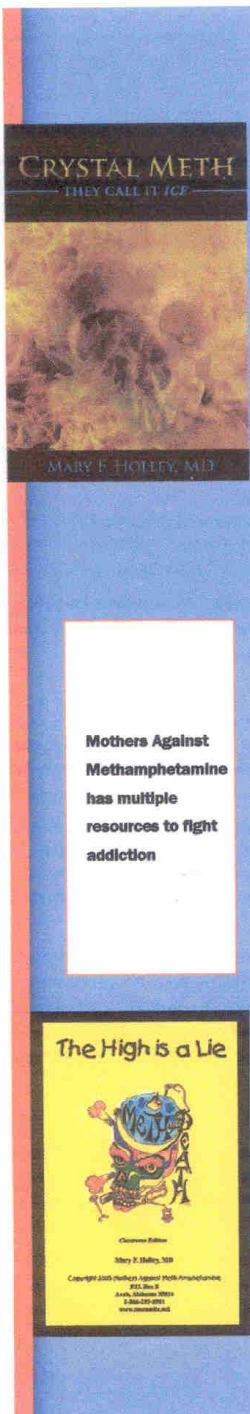
More than 90% of child abuse is drug or alcohol related. Children cannot defend themselves. They are counting on us

Suffer the Little Children

Children raised in drug abusing homes are subjected to severe neglect and abuse. Addicted parents are distracted and pre-occupied by their drug use. They don't notice that their children are hungry and tired. All they can think about is their next high.

A drug using mother is not hungry, so she doesn't buy food. She never gets tired so she doesn't put the children to bed. The children eat dog food and drink out of the toilet. They have no clean cloths to wear. They are unprepared for school.

A first grade teacher noticed that one of her students smelled strange. His breath smelled like dog food. "This six year old child had not even been fed. He was eating what the neighbors left out for their dog."



Taking Action Against Methamphetamine Addiction

Mothers Against Methamphetamine has been fighting addiction since 2001, developing educational materials to prevent addiction, and rehabilitation resources that lead addicts to the cross of Jesus Christ for deliverance and recovery.

Prison Ministry

Outreach to addicts has to begin in the county jail. The only time a drug addict is willing to admit his drug use is a problem is after he has been arrested. He can't deny it anymore. Mothers Against Methamphetamine has a very effective outreach into jails, prisons, and rehabilitation centers.

We offer a quality drug education course called *Power Over Addiction* that teaches the addict about the brain damage associated with drug abuse using brain scans and diagrams. The second half of the course is centered on the authority of God and on the mercy and power of Jesus Christ to defeat addiction. *Power Over Addiction* is widely used in jails and prisons and has changed many lives.

Family Support Groups

The families of methamphetamine addicts go through agony. Addicts lie to their parents, manipulate and abuse them. Parents see their son or daughter get thrown in jail, lose their home, and abuse their grandchildren. They feel helpless to do anything about it.

Mothers chapters sponsor support groups offer encouragement and support to parents and other family members as they learn tough love. Parents pray together and compare notes. The load is a little lighter because it has been shared.

Prevention

Of course an ounce of prevention is worth many pounds of cure. Every addiction prevented avoids years of heart break and the destruction of a young person's life and family. Mothers produces printed educational material and video resources for youth and adults that are used by schools and employers for prevention of addiction.

The High is a Lie video and printed materials come in both adult and youth versions, with booklets for all ages from 3rd grade to adult. These materials are secular in nature and can be used in the public school or workplace setting. They include brain scans and diagrams that detail the brain damage and personality changes caused by meth. *The High is a Lie* also gives the story of an addict who lost his life to methamphetamine addiction.

Mothers Against Methamphetamine also has prevention materials designed for the Christian environment. *Crystal Meth: They Call it Ice—The Video* teaches the same biochemistry and brain scans, personality changes and emotional problems caused by methamphetamine. It also discusses the godless society in which we live and the power and mercy of Jesus Christ to help our youth resist peer pressure. It empowers parents to take control over rebellious children and practice the art of tough love.

Professional Training

Mothers Against Methamphetamine sponsors continuing education events for professionals working with families involved in drug abuse. Teachers, social workers, counselors, nurses and doctors have opportunities to identify and intervene in the addiction cycle if they are trained to recognize signs of addiction in their clients, patients, and students.

Mary Holley, MD author of the book *Crystal Meth: They Call it Ice* and founder of Mothers leads these seminars for both Christian and secular audiences. Secular courses are approved for CEU credit by Jacksonville State University with credit hours applicable to all professional fields.

Financial Information 2006

Mothers Against Methamphetamine Inc. is a 501-C3 tax exempt non-profit organization.

Our financial support comes from donations, sales of books and videotapes, and grants.

In 2006, we did not receive any grant funding.

Donations by public \$39,151 in 2006, down from \$73,694 in 2005

Donations by Dr. Holley \$37,000 in 2006, up from \$8,000 in 2005

Product sales income totaled \$78,483 in 2006, up from \$70,974 in 2005

Seminars and speaking \$6,750 in 2006, up from 0 in 2005

Total income \$161,384 in 2006, up from \$152,668 in 2005

Expenses, however, increased dramatically from 2005, with huge increases in our prison ministry and outreach to addicts and their families.

Total expenses for 2006 were \$188,920 up from \$74,521 in 2005

Of that total, \$20,537 went to our office staff in salaries.

Only \$23,793 was used for fundraising activities.

The majority of the money we spent, \$144,590, was used for program services, \$86,646 for rehabilitation, \$32,364 for education, and \$25,580 for evangelism

Total assets \$96,546, down from \$185,591 at the end of 2005

Financial Crisis

Mothers Against Methamphetamine faced a financial crisis in 2006. Donations and product sales did not generate enough funding to meet the needs of our mission. Grants were not forthcoming, largely because of our Christian status. Needed funds were obtained from our founder and volunteer director, Dr. Mary F Holley and her husband Clay.

Our goal in 2007 is to become financially self sustaining, through improved fundraising and grant writing. To that end, we have hired a professional administrator to assist us in these much needed functions. Genia Garrett is an ordained minister with Masters and Doctorate degrees in Theology. She has worked in substance abuse counseling and has served as a college administrator. She has experience with grant writing and fundraising. She is also enabling our chapters to achieve tax exempt status and engage in fundraising.

We are responsible before God to ensure that Mothers Against Methamphetamine survives and thrives in the future.

Goals For the Future

Mothers Against Methamphetamine is planning great things in the future. We would like to develop new educational materials including:

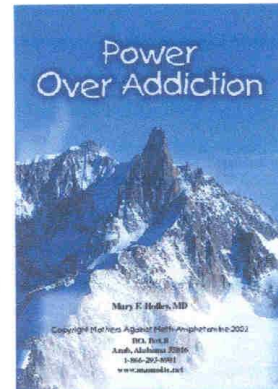
Spanish language translations of all of our materials,

Literature and video resources for employers to use for employee education

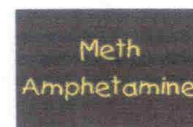
Videotaped and printed professional training materials for teachers, nurses, social workers, law enforcement professionals, and counselors.
