Nothing in this book will be effective if it is applied without prayer. Each community is different; each addict is an individual person. Each Mothers group must be guided by the Holy Spirit to meet the needs in your community.

May the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, Who gave Himself up for our salvation, be with you and in you as you move in your community to love Him, serve Him, and honor Him with the work of your hands.

### **Mission Statement**

## **Welcome to Mothers Against Methamphetamine**

This chapter handbook is prepared to help you assess our organization and assist you in establishing a chapter of Mothers Against Methamphetamine in your area. We are a Christian response to the methamphetamine problem, organized as an independent entity. We are not a government agency, and we are not controlled by any specific denomination. Our national headquarters is in Alabama, but we have district state offices throughout the nation so you can have trained assistance in building your chapter with an awareness of the special needs of your community.

Our focus is on education and prevention of addiction, and on the restoration of addicts as brothers and sisters in Christ to be productive members of society. We offer programs and resources for all age groups and demographic groups. We have chapters in Indian Country and materials in Spanish. We are always looking to expand our reach and increase our impact in the United States and in other nations.

Mothers Against Methamphetamine was organized in 2002 by Dr. Mary Holley, a medical doctor in North Alabama. Faced with the loss of her brother Jim to a drug related suicide, Dr. Holley did extensive research into the causes and effects of methamphetamine addiction. Her work led to the publishing of a book, [Crystal Meth: They Call it Ice](#), and three videotaped presentations, numerous pamphlets and booklets, training seminars for professionals in nursing, education, counseling and law enforcement, and several articles published in professional journals. Our website at [www.mamasite.net](http://www.mamasite.net) includes much of this material in a format for public viewing.

Mothers chapters began organizing nationally in 2004, with the first chapters founded in Florida and Texas. We now have chapters in 15 states in the USA, and in two additional countries. Chapters are involved in education and prevention of addiction by efforts in schools, workplaces, jails and prisons, rehabilitation centers, and churches. We offer support groups for recovering addicts and for the families of addicts as they cope with the reality of dealing with an addicted loved one. We are taking action and mobilizing resources to make a difference in the lives of our children. We are Mothers Against Methamphetamine.

## **Activities of a Mothers Against Methamphetamine Chapter**

The local programs of our chapters are as varied as the communities they serve. There is a special chemistry between the needs of the community and the gifts of the Holy Spirit given to individual members of Mothers groups. Some chapters are devoted entirely to prison ministry working with addicts to set them free. Other chapters focus on prevention with both school and community outreach and education. Others offer support groups to the families of addicts, guiding them through the thicket of tough love. All are using their various gifts and talents to the glory of God in fighting methamphetamine addiction.

Mothers Against Methamphetamine provides the structure and leadership for local chapters to be able to function without having to reinvent the wheel at every turn. We have established a group 501 –C3 exemption to which chapters may subscribe. We have developed training materials in such matters as fundraising, budgeting, board management, and strategic planning so that you can focus your time and attention on ministry. We have developed fundraising tools you can adapt to your local community and

use to raise necessary funds. We offer advice in such areas as grant-writing; though we are not able to write grants for you, we can critique your presentation and improve your chances for success.

Mothers Against Methamphetamine has also developed curriculum materials for schools, jails, rehab centers, and other places of outreach. We have pamphlets, booklets, and videos to meet the needs of our chapters, and we develop new materials as chapters request them. We also maintain a state of the art website where you can find the answer to almost any question about methamphetamine, addiction, or recovery.

## Getting started

Mothers chapters are organized and run by non-professionals - ordinary people with a heart to reach out to the community. You do not have to have a professional degree or a badge on your shirt in order to take action against methamphetamine addiction. You do not even have to be a mother, or the mother of an addict to start a Mothers chapter. You are not required to use the words 'mothers' or 'against' or even 'methamphetamine' in the name of your chapter.

Mothers Against Methamphetamine is prepared to extend our 501-C3 tax-exempt status to our chapters as you complete the training and application process. This will allow you to raise money and give donors a tax deduction for their contributions. It will also allow you to apply for grant funding and compete for United Way funding.

Chapters must be operating legally in the state(s) in which they work, and comply with all state laws regarding non-profit organizations. Some states require formal incorporation. Some require registration with a state agency in order to collect donations within the state. All chapters in the USA must have a federal tax ID number. Using your tax ID number, you should establish a bank checking account and have at least two board members as signatories to the account. Establish a starting balance by contributions from board members. If you must incorporate in your state, hire an attorney to handle the filing for you.

You will be asked to file quarterly activity reports with the Mothers Against Meth national office, and reports will be given back to you summarizing regional and national activities of Mothers Against Meth. This impact information empowers you to apply for local grants and attract donations.

Organizational work should be completed before the first meeting that is open to the public. A core group of 6-8 committed individuals who are motivated to defeat methamphetamine addiction in your community should meet and agree on the Mothers Against Methamphetamine **mission statement** and **statement of faith**. These people will form the Board of Directors for your Mothers Against Methamphetamine chapter. DO NOT try to be the Lone Ranger. Get people involved who are truly committed to this program and are willing to invest time, energy and money to impact your community.

## Board of Directors

When starting a Chapter of Mothers Against Methamphetamine, your Board of Directors is your core group of committed people who are willing to dedicate themselves to the fight against methamphetamine addiction. The Lord Jesus assembles these groups by the power of His Holy Spirit.

Often He selects people who have been scarred in some way by methamphetamine, either in their own lives or the life of a loved one.

Once you have established a board of directors, with a little guidance and training from the National Office, you are qualified to begin ministry in your community based on your own collective experience battling addiction in yourself or a loved one.

It is extremely important that your board of directors be just as committed to your chapter of Mothers Against Methamphetamine as you are. You cannot carry a lot of 'dead weight' on your board. Each participant should have a level of commitment and interest in this organization that is reflected in the time, energy and resources he or she devotes to the organization. If you do not have a group of people who are motivated to make a difference in your community, DO NOT start a chapter at this time. Wait until the Lord moves in hearts and minds to bring together a motivated group of people.

Your board of directors should have participation from a variety of fields and backgrounds. Teachers, business people, clergy, former addicts, family members of addicts, rehabilitation professionals, employers, elderly people, and youth can all be active participants in your board of directors. Don't hesitate to call people you know, show them the national website, and ask them if they would like to be a part of this organization.

Insist on active participation by all board members and remove those who do not contribute. You can get a realistic idea of the level of commitment on the part of individual board members by asking them to contribute some small amount of money to the organization. Those who just want a board membership on their resume will balk at contributing anything of value. Don't involve those people as board members.

At your first organizational meeting please elect officers: president, vice president, treasurer, and secretary. Decide whose phone number will be associated with the Mothers Chapter; this will be the individual who takes all the phone calls and interacts with the press. A cell phone which is passed around is ideal. Please register your chapter with Mothers Against Methamphetamine. A printed application is included with this handbook.

Make other board members chairmen of committees – fundraising, outreach, support group etc. Give everyone on the board a specific job to do. If they do not do their job, replace them promptly. Take nominations from the board to replace vacancies as they arise. Insist on quorum at all meetings. If there is not 50% attendance, no voting can occur; you should cancel the meeting and call the members who did not come. Ask them if they still want to be members. Do not try to make a Mothers Chapter happen all by yourself. Eight board members each contributing five hours per week generate a forty hour workweek for your organization.

If you already have an organization established we do not require you to change your name or adopt our bylaws. Please submit your existing bylaws for review by Mothers Against Methamphetamine. You may integrate Mothers materials and list your organization as a Mothers chapter without losing your established identity. Many of our chapters are organized as substance abuse education organizations or community awareness organizations.

## **Focus of Ministry and Goals**

The board of directors should decide on your chapter's goals and area of emphasis. Each Mothers Chapter is unique and the national office encourages each chapter to meet the specific needs of your community. Each local board has different talents, gifts, and passions and each community has different needs. Mothers Against Methamphetamine is an educational organization and the activities of our chapters should reflect that mission with educational programs for families, youth, addicts, and professionals. Our 501-C3 filing does not permit us to engage in inpatient rehabilitation or housing of addicts, or lobbying of legislators regarding specific bills or candidates.

Some chapters focus on ministry to the parents and loved ones of addicts with emotional and prayer support, information and referral. Be ready to offer referral for treatment to any addict attending one of your meetings. Know the dates, times and locations for addiction support groups in your area. Know the names and phone numbers for rehabilitation centers in your area. Be willing to help a recovered addict set up a recovery meeting or Bible study in your area. Links to national organizations are available on our web site.

Some chapters focus on the public schools by offering their testimony at school events and offering Mothers' literature to school officials. We have a line of non-evangelical literature and video resources for the schools and other secular settings. Other chapters are focused on the addict in the city or county jails or state penitentiary, using Mothers literature to reach them. Often our only opportunity to reach the addict is when he is incarcerated and can no longer deny that he is using or that his drug use is a problem.

All Mothers Chapters seek to educate their communities about the horrific impact of methamphetamine addiction. Community awareness events, professional education seminars, public service announcements and community fairs are all effective ways to raise awareness in your community and educate parents. Events should include information on the early signs of drug use, common paraphernalia, and local resources to obtain counseling and rehabilitation.

## **CHAPTER REQUIREMENTS**

- Initial dues of \$120, annual dues of \$20 per year
- Application filed with the National Office and renewed every two years
- Quarterly report all chapter activities to the National Office Chapter Coordinator [A form will be provided] or District State Office.
- Annual 990 tax reports filed with the District State Office / National MAMA office and the IRS
- Incorporation if required by your state and compliance with all state laws regarding non-profit organizations, including registration with your State Attorney General's Office.
- Agreement with Mothers Against Methamphetamine statement of faith and mission statement.
- Agreement with Mothers Against Methamphetamine statement of faith and mission statement.
- Articles of Association, limitation of liability, and Chapter Authorization form signed by the chapter officers.



Chapters in good standing will be written into the Mothers Against Methamphetamine 501-C-3 non-profit tax exemption upon completion of chapter requirements. 501-C-3 status allows you to engage in fundraising, apply for grants, and partner with other agencies and organizations. You should also register your chapter with the Better Business Bureau in your area. Many people and foundations will not contribute to a non-profit that is not listed with the BBB.

Mothers Against Methamphetamine books and videos are available to chapters at wholesale prices to you to resell in your community. Videotapes are \$18 each for chapters, allowing you to retain \$16 of each sale at the retail price of \$34.95. Crystal Meth: They Call it Ice books are \$12 each for chapters allowing you to retain \$7.95 of each sale at the retail price of \$19.95. Literature is also discounted to our cost for chapters and district state offices.

Mothers requires quarterly chapter activity reports from each chapter. A form is sent to you each quarter for your completion, and is included in the Chapter Training Manual. Your chapter activity report is used to generate impact data both for your local chapter and for the national organization. This data allows Mothers to compete for grants at the local, regional, and national level.

The chapter dues you pay are used to provide chapter services including registration with the IRS as a 501-C3 organization, training in fundraising and grant applications, and compliance with IRS rules. We offer our chapters a listing on our website and a link to your website if you have one.

Chapters may develop their own websites with the help of our web designer, Scotty Baker, [scotty@unlocktheweb.com](mailto:scotty@unlocktheweb.com). If you have Scotty design you a page we ask that you pay the discounted fee he charges for this service. He is very reasonable with his fees. Mothers Against Methamphetamine sponsors an Annual National Conference called **Opening Doors to Recovery**. This conference is an opportunity to network with other chapters and receive training on chapter administration and related topics. We bring in experts on various areas of prevention, intervention, and recovery from addiction. Check the website for the details on our next **Opening Doors to Recovery** Conference.

Additional individual training is available from either the national Mothers Against Methamphetamine office, or your local District State Office. Depending on grant funding availability, you may have to pay travel expenses for your trainer to come to your chapter, but in turn you will receive a community assessment from an experienced chapter leader in addition to our comprehensive training.

## Training for Chapters

Mothers Against Methamphetamine offers training for chapter leaders in several formats. A chapter training manual is available to all chapters, and includes the necessary forms, Articles of Association with the National Organization Mothers Against Methamphetamine, and necessary information to administer a chapter and initiate programming in your community.

In person training is available from the National Mothers Against Methamphetamine office or the District State Office. We will come to your community, usually for between 1 and 3 days, and do a community assessment with you, explore the opportunities for ministry in your community, meet with your local leaders and conduct a training seminar covering all areas of administration of a local chapter. The course includes a spiritual gifts inventory that permits each chapter leader to determine strengths and weaknesses for ministry, instruction on working with a board of directors, fundraising, bookkeeping, grant writing, programming, managing volunteers and paid employees, and filing a 990 return with the IRS.

We also offer on site training in the scientific understanding of addiction and treatment, mental health issues associated with methamphetamine, medical complications related to meth abuse, the effect on the fetus of the pregnant user, child abuse issues related to methamphetamine abuse, strategies for prevention in the school and workplace. These courses can be given as a two day seminar awarding continuing education credit and may be opened to the community as a whole for a fee. This seminar is presented by our founder, Mary F Holley MD. Such a seminar would permit you to network with many professionals in your area with an interest in addiction issues.

If we travel to your chapter for training, we will require a training fee, travel expenses and photocopying expenses to be paid by your chapter. Sometimes we have grant funding available to fund this training, ask your district state office or call the national office to find out if funding is available to cover travel expenses for a trainer. If you would prefer, the training manual can be provided to you for home study on your own, or you may attend the Annual Conference "Opening Doors to Recovery".

## **Resources on the National Website**

Mothers Against Methamphetamine has a web resource for you that is constantly changing and growing. The Frequently Asked Questions area gives answers to the most common questions we receive here at Mothers, and the links area gives you additional resources for referral or further information.

Pictures for display are available on our web site at [www.mamasite.net](http://www.mamasite.net) under the *Images of Addiction area*. You can download and print them to display at your educational gatherings. You can enlarge them and use them as handouts or posters, or for promotional fliers and advertisements. All of the graphics on our site are available to you as our chapter to use for promotional or educational material.

The information section includes annotated and referenced articles by Dr. Holley on a variety of issues of interest to professionals working in the addiction field. Topics include the fetal effects of methamphetamine, the interaction with AIDS, the link between marijuana use and methamphetamine use. Additional topics are added from time to time, making this an information resource for you to share with your community.

Pamphlets have been printed on these and other topics of interest. Check the website for available titles. All of our pamphlets, booklets, and videotapes are available at reduced prices for chapters. Please call the office at 256-498-6262 when ordering at chapter rates, they are not available through the website.

## Understanding Methamphetamine Addiction

Methamphetamine is a vicious addiction. Most of the people using it do not consider themselves addicts. They think they have control over their drug use, and they don't think they are doing anything wrong. They are blind to the pain they are causing to their families and to their children.

The family members of addicts suffer tremendously as they see their loved one disintegrating right before their eyes. Children are abandoned and neglected, wives are verbally and physically abused, addicts end up unemployed, living in the back of a car, or in jail.

The brain damage from methamphetamine is very subtle. The addict can walk and talk and looks perfectly normal. You can't tell anything is wrong until they open their mouths and start talking. They have delusions and hallucinations, they can't control their temper, they are irrational and paranoid, and they are irresponsible and uncaring.

You can't reason with a methamphetamine addict. The only person who can really communicate with an addict is the Holy Spirit. Even the most deranged and irrational addict can understand the movements of the Holy Spirit in his heart. Our job is to get our addicted loved one into a place where he will listen to the Holy Spirit.

The most effective weapon we have against methamphetamine is our prayers. Jesus taught persistence in prayer, and He didn't mean we have to nag God to get Him to do what is right. The addict is broken in many places and believes a lot of lies. Every prayer for the addict is heard and every prayer is answered, usually deep in the heart of that person.

You can't hear the conversations between God and your loved one, and you don't see much in the way of results. This is a healing process, not a magical event. The addict heals from the inside out and his behavior is frequently the last thing to change. You must keep praying in faith believing and praising God for the work He is doing in the heart of your loved one on methamphetamine.

When you pray for your addict, watch out, because things are going to get worse before they get better. He will lose his job, get thrown in jail, or end up living in his car. Relax. God is answering your prayer. He is taking your loved one to a place where there is no one to look to except Him. All his drug buddies will disappear, his life will be revealed as the shambles that it really is, and he will come face to face with his Savior.

Don't sabotage what the Holy Spirit is doing in your loved one's life by bailing him out. Don't bail him out of jail, don't bail him out of his car, don't make his car payment for him, and don't lie to his boss. Let him face the natural consequences of what he is doing. Take in the orphan children, but don't enable your loved one to keep using. When you let him stay high at your place you are encouraging him to keep using, each day causing more irreversible brain damage. Sometimes the kindest thing you can do for your addicted loved one is to kick him out of the house. Prayer group support during this extremely painful time is essential.

## **We are the Body of Christ**

We at Mothers Against Meth-Amphetamine are praying for you, your church, and your community. Twenty years ago, when I was in medical school, crack cocaine swept through the Houston inner city where I was in training. Every night we had five or six overdoses and eight or ten gun shot wounds in the Emergency Room; it looked like a war zone. Law enforcement was helpless against crack cocaine. Education was helpless against crack cocaine. The Body of Christ was not helpless against crack cocaine.

The inner city black churches stood up and said, "We will not tolerate this." They preached against it, taught against it, took in the orphan children, started rehab centers right there in their churches, and they prayed a mighty prayer. Crack cocaine use has plummeted in the inner city areas where it was such a problem 20 years ago. The average teenager won't touch a rock of crack cocaine with a 10-foot pole.

We can do the same thing with methamphetamine. Drug abuse is primarily a spiritual problem, not a legal or law enforcement problem. We cannot expect law enforcement to solve a spiritual problem. It's not their job. It's our job. When the Body of Christ unites and moves, all the forces of hell cannot prevail against it. Our armor is mostly defensive, shield, breastplate, and helmet, but we are also armed with a sword, the Word of God.

If you are interested in forming a chapter of Mothers Against Methamphetamine, please complete this application form. This should be done as a group with the people you plan to work with in the activities of your chapter. Agree among yourselves on a name for your group – it does not have to include the words "Mothers" "Against" or "Methamphetamine." Chose an initial focus and mission statement, remembering you can change your chosen mission as new members join your group with different gifts and talents.
